Teachers Awarded \$500!



The Brooklyn Chamber of Commerce offered a \$500 grant opportunity for any teacher in the Brooklyn City School District this spring. The 2013-2014 Educator Grant was a testimony to the fact that the Brooklyn Chamber understands the financial constraints of many in the educational field and chose to offer an avenue of financial support for a teacher or a group of teachers. The teachers were required to write a lesson idea which outlined a need, a pur-

pose, a solution, and a product which would enable their students to value a project-based unit of instruction with real-life application. In 1,000 words or less the teachers described an idea with details, how it corresponded to the State Standards, the needed resources and how it provided an authentic learning experience.

This year we were lucky to have two sets of winners. As the first recipient, Wendy Smith, our Media Specialist and Tech Coach along with the second grade teachers identified the five indicators in the second grade that deal with the field of economics. Students will be studying a business creation, making a product (lemonade) while utilizing technology and literature. Eventually the students will

participate in a classroom project blending school work and positive behaviors. Our second recipient, the AVID (Achievement via Individual Determination) teachers wrote a grant to provide transportation for the enrolled students to have an authentic college visitation experience while planning for their futures. The Brooklyn City School District appreciates the generosity and understanding of the Chamber and thanks its members for their continued support of the City of Brooklyn

This certification is a true benefit to our business community as insurance companies use the Public Protection Classification program information for marketing, underwriting, and to help establish fair premiums for homeowners and commercial fire insurance. Worker Compensation Changes



Starting April 28, 2014, **Managed Care Open Enrollment begins**. Open enrollment gives all state-fund employers (with an active workers' compensation policy) an opportunity to choose a managed care organization (MCO) to help manage the medical portion of their workers' compensation claims. A strong MCO-employer partnership also helps injured workers receive the treatment they need to get back to work as safely and quickly as possible.

What you should look for in a managed care organization

There is no out-of-pocket expense to select an MCO; however, enrollment is limited to once every two years for one month only. This makes your decision extremely important.

- → Look at the BWC report card and identify the MCO that scores high on the MoD Days Absent Measurement. This measure indicates how quickly the MCO returns the injured worker back to the job. The higher the score, the more effective the MCO performs in timeliness based on statewide averages. The quicker the return-to-work, the more likely you will save on premium.
- → Consider the size of the MCO. Are you comfortable with a large organization or would you prefer a mid-sized MCO? Benefits 1 Group prides itself on our ability to serve each client as if they are our only client. As a mid-sized TPA, we have the resources to work one-on-one and provide a team to each client; however, we are agile enough to tailor our services to meet each clients' needs. You should seek this out in an MCO as well.

Group Retrospective rating enrollment closes at the end of April How this program works:

Employers continue to pay their own individual premiums and have the opportunity to receive retrospective premium adjustments based upon the combined performance of the group. Depending on that performance, the participating employers can receive either a premium refund or assessment. This plan provides incentives to the group retro members to control and reduce losses. So, those members who control losses have the potential to see lower premiums. Some of your clients may have received offers for this program. If the employer has enrolled in traditional group experience rating, he or she cannot enroll in group retro. We apologize for any confusion this may have caused, and will let the employers know if they have received both offers. However, this is a good option for employers who don't qualify for group rating, so please let us know if any you are considering this option.

Ohio BWC Program deadline changes have been approved by the board. The deadlines were moved up in preparation for the system to start billing prospectively. Here is a link to the BWC's memo: Modernizing BWC. The program deadlines for the rest of calendar year 2014 are now:


