We are Daniel & Jessica Cliff, owners and instructors at the U.S. Shuai Chiao Kung Fu Academy. We joined the Brooklyn Chamber of Commerce in 2011 when we opened our Martial Arts business on Memphis Ave on the edge of Brooklyn and West Cleveland. We have recently moved to a newer, bigger space at 4315 Ridge Road in the heart of Brooklyn.

Daniel and I pride ourselves on being much more than "just another Martial Arts school". We believe that being a family run business has helped establish us with the young families in the community. At our school we focus on the community by being involved with fundraisers, food drives, and car washes that benefit the local schools and residents. Within the school we host events and contests each month that encourage camaraderie between the students. Some of the most looked forward to events for our students are our sleepovers! Especially our New Years Eve Sleepover!

Kung fu is a "soft style" of Martial Arts which means it's easy on the joints. There are many styles of Kung Fu out there, at our school we focus on Shuai Chiao and San Shou. "Shuai Chiao" is Chinese style wrestling or grappling. Shuai Chiao is the oldest form of recorded Martial Arts. It utilizes strikes, disruptive hand techniques, kicks and joint locks in the context of takedown throws. You'll learn how to gain dominance and fight efficient in close quarters. San Shou, or free fighting is a modern hand to hand self-defense system and combative sport. San Shou includes punches, kicks, throws, locks, grappling and submissions. Both styles of Kung Fu are included in all of the class curriculum. Meaning that our 3&4 year old toddlers learn our curriculum just as our Tiny's, Juniors and Adults learn it. (all at an age appropriate pace of course!)
