The Chamber Bright Stars for 2012 were recognized on Thursday, October 25th at the semi-annual Chamber Leadership meeting and fifth annual Bright Star Awards presentation of the Northern Ohio Area Chambers of Commerce (NOACC) at the Great Lakes Science Center in Cleveland, Ohio.

The recipient for the Brooklyn Chamber of Commerce was Denise Christescu with Westbrook Village Apts/K&D. Denise has been a very active member since she joined the Brooklyn Chamber of Commerce several years ago. When the Chamber was looking for new Board members this year, Denise stepped up to fill this vacancy. She has put forth a lot of work and effort over the past several years to assure the Chamber and its various events were a success. Denise has volunteered at all of our events, including Taste of Brooklyn and our Joint Golf outing. She has spent countless hours this past year on our "Picnic in the Park" community event, to organize volunteers, donate printing, and gather sponsorships, to name a few. Denise is always willing and eager to donate her time and support the Chamber and the Brooklyn community.

### **Teacher Grant Awarded**

Congratulations to the Kindergarten team at Brookridge Elementary for being the Chamber's 2013 Teacher Grant Recipient. The grant provided \$500 for a teacher or a group of teachers with a lesson idea which outlines a need, a purpose, a solution, and a product which will enable students to value a project-based unit of instruction with real-life application. Applicants were required to submit, in 1,000

words or less, a description of their ideas, how it corresponds to the Standards, the resources that are needed, and how it will provide an authentic learning experience for the class.

According to Michelle Hopkins, Brookridge Kindergarten Team Leader, "this generous grant will help us to implement our new Social Studies Economics Standard. Economics is one of the four strands that Kindergarten students will study. Under this strand, they must understand the following content: "Goods are objects that can satisfy people's wants." The grant will allow students to engage in authentic learning activities to help them understand the differences between goods and services, and why we need both. Kindergarten students will spend the month of April or May exploring community helpers, and the services they provide to meet our needs and wants. Our dramatic play centers will be transformed into construction zones, post offices, restaurants, and more as students play the roles of service providers. "Dramatic play permits children to fit the reality of the world into their own interests and knowledge. One of the purest forms of symbolic thought available to young children, dramatic play contributes strongly to the intellectual development of children" (Piaget, 1962). After exploring the roles of different service providers, students will choose their favorite to use in an informational writing piece. We will also be using digital cameras to take pictures of students exploring the roles of different service providers." Congratulations to the Kindergarten team!



#### Health care reform update: exchanges



As an employer, you've heard a lot about health care reform. You probably have questions about what it means for you and your employees.

To help answer your questions, we're providing a series of articles in the coming months. Each article will discuss the latest in health care reform and highlight steps

you may need to take to comply with the law.

#### Health insurance exchanges

One of the biggest changes is the introduction of **health insurance exchanges**. They will be run by the state or federal government. Health care companies on the exchange offer their own set of plans which include a basic set of essential health benefits. Small businesses can shop, compare plays side by side and pick the plan that works best for them.

Enrollment in exchanges is scheduled to start in October 2013 and coverage should begin in January 2014. If you have questions about the exchange, you will be able to contact an exchange call center and talk with a live person who can answer your questions about your health insurance options.

To make buying health care coverage more affordable, you may qualify for a subsidy or tax credit so you pay less for coverage. Contact the exchange call center for more details.

#### Flexible spending account change

Starting on January 1, 2013, employees who have flexible spending accounts (FSAs) must limit their contributions to \$2,500 a year.
