BROOKLYN HISTORICAL SOCIETY LUNCHEON



The Brooklyn Historical Society welcomed our Chamber members on Thursday, May 21st for our monthly luncheon. Panera Bread catered the event and tours were offered to all those in attendance. We also presented all of our Past Presidents with plaques to thank them for their hard work and dedication.

After lunch was served, Barbara Stepic introduced the Board members and gave a short bio on each of them. Following introductions, a history lesson was presented explaining the founding Brooklyn Township in 1818 and its boundaries at that time. Brooklyn became a village in the spring of 1927 and was chartered as a city in the early 50's.

The Historical Society was founded in 1970 by then Councilwoman, Elizabeth Wachs. They moved into the 1929 home in 1973 and an addition was built in 1983. The membership roster has about 150 members.

Explanations were given for some of the ventures the members had taken to secure more history for the Museum's archives. One was researching old records in 2000 at Western Reserve Historical Society Library and recording Mrs. Ruth Ketteringham regarding the early history of the area. On another trip, members photographed the quarries behind the early K-Mart store. They are constantly on the look out for old photos of the area.

Barb described some of the jobs the members had done to complete the addition of the museum back in 1983. She also told of the school tours,



meetings, potlucks, brunches, cleaning days, gardening jobs, clipping local news articles from the last 40 years, and the quilts and crafts members make. She also explained the workings of the two harness floor loom used to make rag rugs. Almost 90% of the items in the museum are donated and members record the item in a journal and mark the item with the same number so they know who donated them.

Their library is a storehouse of old records such as all of the Brooklyn High School yearbooks, old voting records, copies of old plat books, old township records, area maps from the 1800's, old records, and scrapbooks from Laurel Garden Club, Brooklyn PTA groups, Friends of the Brooklyn Library, BHS group pictures from the early 40's to 1957, bound volumes of the Old Brooklyn News from 1948-1960 and many, many photos. They have compiled large binders named "On the Street Where You Live", which hold recent and old photos of Biddulph, Brookpark, Memphis, Ridge, Tiedeman, and a mix of others.

Fundraising projects were described, one of which is their annual Shunpike Shoppe held at the Museum the last full weekend of September. Everyone who works for the Museum are volunteers. The Museum pays their own utilities, rent, security, liability, and upkeep of the inside and outside gardens.

The Brooklyn Historical Society Museum is located at 4442 Ridge Road. The museum is open on Tuesdays from 10:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. An appointment can be made if you wish to do research or take a tour, so that they have the proper help and information available.
