### BROOKLYN City Schools





The Brooklyn Chamber of Commerce offered a \$500 grant opportunity for any teacher in the Brooklyn City School District this spring.

The <u>2011 Educator</u> <u>Grant</u> was a testimony to the fact that the Brooklyn Chamber understands the financial constraints of many in the educational field and chose to offer an avenue of financial support for a teacher or a group of teachers.

The teachers were required to write a lesson idea which outlined a need, a purpose, a solution, and a product which would enable their students to value a project-based unit of instruction with real-life application. In 1,000 words or less the teachers described an idea with details, how it corresponded to the State Standards, the needed resources and how it provided an authentic learning experience. Eight teachers applied for the grant.

TEACHER GRANT AWARDED!

As the recipients of the grant, the second grade teachers identified the five indicators in the second grade that deal with the field of economics.

Students would be required to read books about producers, consumers, goods, services, jobs, money and manufacturing at their reading level while creating flowcharts of nec-

#### essary resources.

Eventually the students would participate in a classroom factory project. Each of the stations in the factory would be an ingredient in a "Bee Ready Bag." Items such as flashcards, puzzles for word lists, and a memory book to prepare for third grade would be in the bag.

At the conclusion of the factory project, students would use their "income" from their factory job to buy the finished bag. As you can see in the pictures, the children enjoyed their activities while learning economics!


